

# Resources for Sexual Assault, Sexual Harassment, Dating/Domestic Violence, and Stalking Response



## Confidential Support

Resources that are designated as confidential hold legal privilege and will not disclose any information to CSUDH or the police. They will provide you with support and resources, including the option to report.

*What happens when I talk to a confidential resource?*

A CSUDH Confidential resource will listen to you and provide information about organizations on and off campus, like medical services, psychological services, and free advocacy services. They will also provide information on how to report the incident to the Title IX Officer at CSUDH or to the police, and will not discourage you from reporting the incident. They will not share your information with anyone unless there is a threat of harm to you or the CSUDH community.

*Who are confidential resources at CSUDH?*

The CSUDH Victim Advocate, as well as Advocates from other organizations, and licensed medical/psychological staff at Student Health and Psychological Services are Confidential resources.

## Responsible to Report

Resources that are designated as responsible must disclose incidents of sexual assault, harassment, dating/domestic violence, and stalking to the Title IX Officer to ensure that follow-up and tracking occurs.

*What happens when I talk to a resource that is responsible?*

A CSUDH responsible resource will contact the Title IX Officer to provide information about the incident that you have provided them with, such as your name and contact information, a description, and the date and location of the incident. The Title IX Officer will follow up with you and ask if you would like to meet to discuss resources and options, including reporting to CSUDH or the police and supportive confidential resources like advocacy and psychological services.

*Who are responsible resources at CSUDH?*

Most CSUDH employees are responsible for reporting incidents to the Title IX Officer and are informed yearly about this responsibility, including but not limited to all professors, instructors, coaches, directors, deans, and coordinators.
