

Why we cite?

- Situate place our work in conversation
- Give credit to others show which ideas are attributed to others
- Trustworthiness Can increase our own as creators
- Exploration allows readers to explore source materials more and examine the topic on their own

Heavy winds cause downed utility livacross Long Beach



More than a dozen utility lines and some trees across the city have been blown down in what officials are calling the "coldest storm of the season, and possibly the last several years," to hit Long Beach and much of Southern California.

Since winds started picking up Tuesday afternoon, the Long Beach Fire Department has received 16 reports of downed utility lines—five yesterday and 11 today, department spokesperson Jake Heflin said late Wednesday morning.

"For us, the responsibility is to get there and make sure the area is safe and there's not an immediate threat or hazard," Heflin said.



Citation has power

Citing something, intentionally or not, give that author power. Sara Ahmed has described this as "feminist memory" where we acknowledge those who come before us.

Miranda Fricker also describes citation as a form of epistemic justice, meaning that by citing someone you are saying their words and ideas are worth knowing. Lack of citation signals the opposite.

Traditional scholarly citation practices only acknowledge the core authors but often many more people contribute to a work than ever get credit (check out acknowledgements and methodology sections)

Citation has power

Citation can be more than just a passive reflection of what you've read going into a piece. Many scholars cite based on reputation, canon, people they know, etc. There are interdisciplinary calls to cite work you value and to diversify the work represented in citation.

Organization Tips

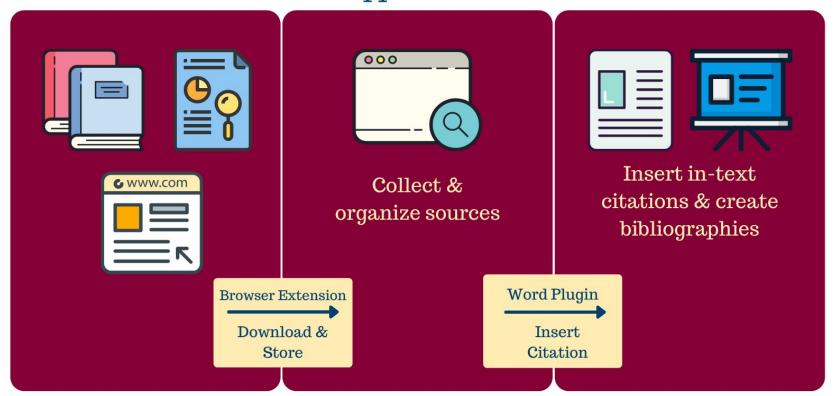
- Once you find a source, keep track of all the bibliographic data even if it's more than you think you'll need
- Keep notes! Don't forget to include page numbers for direct quotations and paraphrasing
- Keep all your sources in a consistent place
- Rename any downloaded articles so they're easily identifiable




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


Browser caveats


- Works with Chrome, Firefox, Safari, Edge

Manual Entry

There are lots of ways to use Zotero!

- Synching between different devices
- Creating groups (ex: reading list for a presentation or a shared research project)
- Add or create <u>specialized citation styles</u> to save you time
- Build your zotero <u>profile</u> to connect other researchers to your work
- Import citations from another manager or from database search results using an .RIS file
- Keep track of your readings and develop your own personal library over time which will stay with you even after CSUDH
